



Consequences

C1: First Consequence

- Verbal warning
- Name written on board

Examples of behaviour that will trigger C1:

- Talking inappropriately
- Interrupting a teacher
- Moving out of seat

C2: Second Consequence

Tick placed against name on the board and recorded on monitoring sheet / eportal.

Examples of behaviour that will trigger C2:

- A further C1 offence
- Students failing to bring appropriate equipment

C3: Third Consequence

- Two ticks against name on the board
- School detention for the following school day will be triggered (30 minutes) – Monday to Friday
- The student will be issued with a letter to take home and it is their responsibility to inform parents.

Examples of behaviour that will trigger C3:

- Repeated failure to bring required equipment
- Chewing / eating in class
- Failure to submit homework punctually
- Late for lesson without valid reason
- Non-compliance with a teacher's request
- Vandalism

C4: Fourth Consequence 'On Call'

The student will be removed from the lesson and taken to the Seclusion Base using the 'on call' procedure. This triggers a C5 detention.

C5: Fifth Consequence – Failure of C3 or C4 Consequence

- Will trigger a 45 minute detention on a Friday evening
- A detention letter will be sent home to parents (or appropriate telephone call made)

C6: Sixth Consequence – Failure of C5 or Persistent C3 Detentions – Seclusion

- Seclusion – students work in the Seclusion Base for the day. Break and lunch will be taken at different times to the rest of the school.
- Parents may be asked to come into school to see Head of Year or other Senior Member of staff.
- May lead to a one-day exclusion

Poor behaviour at break times and lunch times around school, will also trigger **consequences**.

If a student gains more than 9 points (C2 = 2 points, C3 = 3 points etc) they may not be allowed to participate in school trips or activities.
