

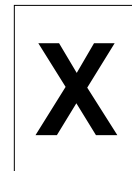


Sixth Form Dress Code

- Excessively ripped jeans are not allowed.

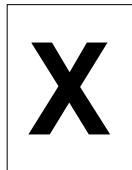

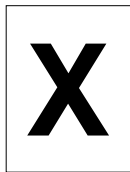




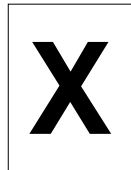
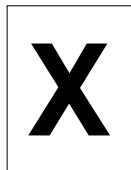
- Hats, including baseball caps are not allowed in school.
